**Legislative Process**

The California State Legislature is comprised of two houses, the Assembly and the Senate. The Assembly, known as the lower house, has a total of 80 members and the Senate has 40 members. A Legislative Session runs in two-year cycles, with legislative recesses occurring each year from mid-September through December. Approximately 5,682 bills are introduced during a two-year legislative session.

The legislative process requires most bills to pass through a policy and fiscal committee in each house. In addition, a bill must achieve passage off the Assembly and Senate floors prior to going to the Governor for final action.

A bill can take up to two years to move through the Legislature and reach the Governor's desk. Once before the Governor, a measure must be enacted into law or vetoed within 15 days.

The **author** of a bill is the legislator who submits the bill.

The **sponsor** of a bill is the special interest group who asked the Legislature to author a particular measure. Sponsored bills in this report are sponsored by CSEA and are the result of actions on resolutions at the CSEA Annual Conference or actions by the CSEA Board of Directors.

A **bill** can also be referred to as a measure or as a piece of legislation.

**Bill Status Legend:**

Active:	Means the bill is actively moving through the legislative process.
Vetoed:	Means the bill successfully passed out of the Assembly and Senate but was vetoed by the Governor.
Chaptered:	Means the bill has successfully passed out of the Assembly and Senate and has been signed into law by the Governor.
Failed Passage:	Means measure has died due to lack of votes for passage.

**AB 745**      **(Goldberg- (D)) – School Administrator Compensation**

Purpose: To require every school and community college district to annually report at a public board meeting the total compensation paid to top administrators, including details in all monetary and non-monetary compensation and benefits.

Purpose: To grant classified employees the same rights that certificated employees have with regard to a reorganization of a County Office of Education, and to provide parity regarding personal necessity leave.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 843*

**AB 1070**      **(Laird - (D)) – Reclassification Period Under the Merit System**

Purpose: To reduce the reclassification period under the merit system from three years to two years.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 181*

**AB 1507** **(Negrete-McLeod (D)) – Consolidation of the California State University Police Departments**

Purpose: To consolidate the 23 individual California State University police departments into a singular California State University police department with a regional management structure.

Status: Active

**AB 1973** **(Nation (D)) – Budget Negotiation Authority**

Purpose: To provide the California State University more authority to negotiate employment agreements within the overall funding provided by the Legislature.

Status: Active

**SB 162** **(Alarcón - (D)) – Housing Programs**

Purpose: To provide classified school employees with the same ability to participate in housing assistance programs as teachers and administrators.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 853*

**SB 644** **(Burton - (D)) – Community College Board of Governors**

Purpose: To add a classified employee member to the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 860*

**SB 1445** **(Dunn (D)) – Implementation of CSU Peace Officer Staffing Study**

Purpose: To implement the joint SUPA/CSU study on police officer staffing on campuses of the California State University, and to seek funding to implement the findings.

Status: Active

**SB 1602** **(Soto (D)) – Pre-Retirement Death Benefits**

Purpose: To provide classified and local members of CalPERS the same pre-retirement death benefits that state employees receive, granting the survivors of employees who die prior to retirement lifetime pensions.

Status: Active

**AB 86** **(Daucher - (R)) – Home Rule Charter School Districts**

Purpose: To authorize a school district or county office to become a home rule district, exempting them from most laws and creating a categorical block grant for these districts. A home rule district is when the entire district becomes a charter.

**AB 122**                    **(Calderon (D)) – Manufacturer’s Investment Tax Credit**

Purpose:                    To extend the manufacturer’s investment tax credit (MIC) to January 1, 2006 or the first year in which the state doesn’t add at least 100,000 manufacturing jobs. The MIC has failed to produce the minimum level of jobs required while having the effect of reducing the state general fund reserves. In turn, redlined general fund revenues have a negative impact on Proposition 98 funding.

Purpose:                    Proposes to extend the sunset date for the Internet Tax Freedom Act from January 1, 2004 to January 2008.

Purpose:                    To repeal state law requiring overtime pay for work in excess of 8 hours a day, and 40 hours per week in the private sector.

Status:                    *Failed Passage*

**AB 293**                    **(Daucher-(R)) – Health Care and Overtime**

Purpose:                    To promote a voluntary based health care program for small employers and provide that workers can work an additional hour without overtime pay to fund health benefits.

Status:                    Active

**AB 349**                    **(Haynes (R)) – Vouchers for Compton Unified School District**

Purpose:                    To create a school voucher program for parents in the Compton Unified School District to be used to attend public or private schools.

Status:                    Active

**AB 363**                    **(Garcia (R)) – Tax Credit for Agriculture Workers Health Care**

Purpose:                    To provide a new tax credit of up to \$80,000 for qualified taxpayers who provide health care coverage for their agricultural employees and their dependents, and would have a negative impact on Proposition 98 funds. This measure is a counter-measure to negate proposals by labor to trade-off existing tax breaks for health benefits for farm workers.

**AB 424**                    **(Richman (R)) – Los Angeles Unified School District: Appointment from Eligibility Lists**

Purpose:                    To provide that the Los Angeles Unified School District may make appointments from eligibility lists outside of the first three ranks under specified circumstances. This measure incorporates agreements reached between the district and the classified employee organizations.

Status:                    *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 881*

**AB 431**                    **(Mountjoy - (R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To narrow provisions in the Labor Code that require workers' compensation laws to be liberally construed, making it harder for injured workers to receive benefits.

Status: *Failed Passage*

**AB 484** **(Cogdill (R)) – Tax Exemption for Specified Banks and Corporations**

Purpose: To exempt banks and corporations with gross receipts of less than \$1 million and no profits from the states minimum franchise tax. This exemption will reduce state revenues, and therefore, have a negative impact on Proposition 98.

Status: Active

**AB 628** **(Runner-(R)) – Real Property Withholding Requirements**

Purpose: To modify the withholding requirement to exempt individuals that are sole proprietors engaged in the business of building or selling residential property. This proposal would reduce tax revenues; and therefore, have a negative impact on Proposition 98 funding.

Status: Active

**AB 678** **(Firebaugh (D)) – New Corporations**

Purpose: To prohibit new corporations from paying taxes until the corporation has been in existence for 3 years or grosses \$500,000 in gross receipts, whichever occurs first. This exemption will reduce state revenues, and therefore, have a negative impact on Proposition 98.

Status: Active

**AB 989** **(La Malfa-(R)) – Corporate Taxes Credit – Rice Straw**

Purpose: To eliminate the tax credit limit of \$400,000 on the purchase of California grown rice straw. This proposal could reduce tax revenue, and therefore, have a negative effect on Proposition 98 funding.

**AB 1018** **(Nakanishi-(R)) – Prevailing Wages**

Purpose: To exempt school facility new construction or modernization projects from any requirement to pay local prevailing wages.

Status: Active

**AB 1097** **(Cogdill - (R)) – Small School Districts: Four-Day Work Week**

Purpose: To allow a small school district to elect to operate any school in a four-day school week, without requiring collective bargaining or a vote of the employees.

Status: Active

**AB 1223** **(McCarthy - (R)) – Repeal of Layoff Notice: Private Sector**

Purpose: To repeal laws requiring 60-day notice of layoff for private sector workers when a mass layoff, relocation or termination occurs.

Status: *Failed Passage*

**AB 1270**                    **(Dutton-(R)) – Investment Credit**

Purpose:                    To expand the sales and use tax exemption and income and corporation tax credits to include electric power generation. This proposal would reduce tax revenues and therefore, have a negative impact on Proposition 98 revenues.

Status:                    Active

**AB 1327**                    **(Wyland-(R)) – Family Disability Leave Insurance**

Purpose:                    To provide that only businesses that employ 50 or more individuals within a 75-mile radius of the worksite of the individual requesting the leave, to provide the six-week family leave, and to set a minimum of 1,250 hours during the previous 12 month period for eligibility.

Status:                    *Failed Passage*

**AB 1421**                    **(Cogdill (R)) – Prevailing Wages**

Purpose:                    To exclude contracted maintenance work and community facilities districts public works projects from paying prevailing wages.

Status:                    *Failed Passage*

**AB 1646**                    **(Benoit - (R)) – Repeal of SB 1419 (Alarcón) – Contracting Out**

Purpose:                    To repeal the provisions of Chapter 894 of the Statutes of 2002 (SB 1419 (Alarcón)), enacted in 2002, to establish guidelines and standards for contracting out classified jobs.

Status:                    Active

**AB 1789**                    **(Corbett (R)) – Tax Exemption for Live Science Companies**

Purpose:                    To exempt personal property used in the start up of specified life science companies from personal property tax assessment.

Status:                    Active

**AB 1791**                    **(Chavez (D)) – California Internet Tax Freedom Act**

Purpose:                    To extend the sunset date for the California Internet Tax Freedom Act until January 2010, costing millions in lost revenues to the state and public education.

Status:                    Active

**AB 1869**                    **(Maldonado (R)) – Tax Exemption for Space Flight Facilities**

Purpose:                    To expand the sales tax exemption for space flight property to include space flight facilities. This bill would result in reduced general fund revenues which would have a detrimental impact on funding for education, health and safety programs.

Status:                    Active

**AB 1888**                    **(Nakanishi (R)) – Medical Savings Account**

Purpose:                    To permit any eligible individual to claim deduction under personal income tax law for the amount deposited in the Medical Savings Account.

Status: Active

**AB 2034**      **(Campbell (R)) – Agency Shop**

Purpose: To repeal agency shop provisions that apply to local public agencies under the Meyers-Milias-Brown Act for confidential and supervisory employees.

Status: Active

**AB 2052**      **(Haynes (R)) – Labor Law: Collective Bargaining**

Purpose: To impose new burdens and restrictions on private sector unions regarding political activity, political expenditures, and membership organizing and to repeal the public policy of the state providing that workers be permitted to organize and engage in collective bargaining.

Status: Active

**AB 2061**      **(Haynes (R)) – Tax Exemption: Business Tax**

Purpose: To create the Business Activity Tax Simplification Act which would expand the number and quality of contacts a business needs to have in the state before being required to pay state taxes. This bill would significantly reduce general fund revenues, which might otherwise be available to mitigate cuts to education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**AB 2124**      **(Campbell (R)) – Sweatshop Labor**

Purpose: To repeal requirements that the Department of Industrial Relations establish a sweat-free code of conduct and limit the contracts subject to oversight and certification. A sweat-free code of conduct requires state agencies to certify that foreign made products are not produced by forced, convict, indentured or abusive child labor.

Status: Active

**AB 2163**      **(Leslie (R)) – Offshore Contracting**

Purpose: To allow the processing and transcription of private medical records in countries offshore, as long as patients provide consent.

Status: Active

**AB 2181**      **(Campbell (R)) - Repeal of Private Attorney General Act of 2004**

Purpose: To repeal the Private Attorney General Act, which was put in place to allow employees to bring civil action to enforce violations of the Labor Code. This law was put in place to address the fact that state enforcement agencies are under-staffed and under-funded, and can't keep up with claims.

Status: Active

**AB 2192**      **(Houston (R)) – Sale or Transfer of Unused Net Operating Losses**

Purpose: To allow a qualified bioscience company to sell its unused net operating losses to another qualified bioscience company. This bill would result in reduced general fund revenues which would have a detrimental impact on funding for education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**AB 2195**      **(Campbell (R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To repeal provisions requiring contractors that use temporary agencies ensure these agencies pay workers’ compensation premiums for the temporary employees.

Status: Active

**AB 2230**      **(Corbett (D)) – Bioscience Tax Credits**

Purpose: To provide a package of tax credits and other benefits for qualified bioscience companies. This bill would result in reduced general fund revenues which would have a detrimental impact on funding for education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**AB 2239**      **(Runner (R)) – Exceptions from Classified Service**

Purpose: To expand the exemptions from the classified service in community colleges to include any full-time or part-time student working part-time.

Status: Active

**AB 2315**      **(Maldonado (R)) – Tax Deductions: Health Savings Accounts**

Purpose: To allow an individual to deduct an amount equal to the total amount paid to a health savings account. These types of deductions primarily benefit wealthy taxpayers. Lower income taxpayers who do not have health insurance and cannot afford to make deposits to a health savings account would not benefit from a deduction.

Status: Active

**AB 2320**      **(Bates (R)) – Reducing Weekly Benefits for Unemployed worker**

Purpose: To reduce the maximum weekly unemployment benefit by \$40.00 for those employees who become unemployed after January 1, 2005.

Status: Active

**AB 2322**      **(Bates (R)) – Family Temporary Disability Insurance Program**

Purpose: To allow employees to opt out of the family temporary disability insurance program, which assesses a small increase in the S.D.I tax, to create a paid family leave for employees paying the tax. An opt out provision would risk the solvency of the paid family leave program.

Status: Active

**AB 2328**      **(Wyland (R)) – Operating Loss and Tax Credit Carryover for “S”  
(Shareholder) Corporation**

Purpose: To allow an “S” (Shareholder) corporation to carry forward a net operating loss or tax credit that it incurred as a standard general for profit corporation. This bill would result in reduced general fund revenues which would have a detrimental impact on funding for education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**AB 2365**      **(Correa (D)) – Tax Exemption: Wage Credit**

Purpose: To authorize a tax credit up to \$1,500 for wages paid to employees engaged in a manufacturing trade or business. This bill would reduce general fund revenue that might otherwise be available to mitigate cuts to education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**AB 2415**      **(Garcia (R)) – Contracting Out Classified Jobs**

Purpose: To repeal various sections of law dealing with contracting out services performed by classified school employees.

Status: Active

**AB 2460**      **(Campbell (R)) – Holidays: State Employees**

Purpose: To declare the Legislature’s intent to enact legislation to reduce the number of state employee holidays from 13 holidays to 10.

Status: Active

**AB 2484**      **(Ridley-Thomas (D)) – Tax Exemption: Manufacture’s Investment Tax Credit**

Purpose: To enact a 6% manufacture’s investment tax credit (MIC) for the purchase of qualified tangible personal property. Previous MIC statutes failed to produce the minimum level of jobs required while having the effect of reducing state general fund revenues.

Status: Active

**AB 2495**      **(Dutton (R)) – Commission on Health and Safety and Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To change the make-up of the Commission on Health and Safety and Workers’ Compensation, requiring two physicians and a chiropractor, thereby weakening the ratio of union representatives on the commission.

Status: Active

**AB 2575**      **(Haynes (R)) – State Employee Collective Bargaining: Repeal of Provisions**

Purpose: To repeal provisions of the Ralph C. Dills Act that provide that provisions of an expired memorandum of understanding continue to be in effect, including provisions that supercede existing law, provisions related to arbitration, no strike provisions, and agreements covered in the Fair Labor Standards Act.

Status: Active

**AB 2590**      **(Campbell (R)) – Multistate Business Income**

Purpose: To change the method by which multistate businesses calculate their income derived from business in California. This would result in an initial revenue loss of approximately \$165 million annually. This lost revenue might otherwise be available to mitigate cuts to education.

Status: Active

**AB 2592**                    **(Campbell (R)) – Personal Property Assessment**

Purpose:                    To require local assessors and the State Board of Equalization to assess property at its actual cost, as adjusted by depreciation rather than the property’s fair market value. This bill would reduce general fund revenues which might otherwise be available to mitigate cuts to education and would result in a lack of uniformity in assessment of personal property.

Status:                    Active

**AB 2650**                    **(Bates (R)) – Private Attorneys General Act of 2004**

Purpose:                    To repeal provisions the Private Attorneys General Act of 2004 (enacted by Governor Davis) for employers that employ fewer than 100 employees within a 75 mile radius. This Act protects farm workers and many other workers by letting employee(s) act as “Private Attorney General” to enforce the Labor Code, when the labor agency cannot due to staff and budget limitations.

Status:                    Active

**AB 2764**                    **(Bates (R)) – Charter School: Authorization**

Purpose:                    Authorizes the governing boards of the UC, CSU and Community Colleges to submit an application to establish a charter school.

Status:                    Active

**AB 2781**                    **(Benoit (R)) – Charter School Operation**

Purpose:                    Deletes the current cap on the number of charter schools in California. Current law allows 650 charter schools to exist, increasing by 100 per year. Right now there are 405 schools in operation.

Status:                    Active

**AB 2903**                    **(Campbell (R)) – Reductions in Retirement Benefits**

Purpose:                    To increase by 1% the amount all state employees must contribute towards their retirement benefits, force all state miscellaneous and industrial members of CalPERS into tier two retirement (1.25% at age 65 rather than 2% at age 55), and to reduce maximum pensions for state patrol safety and peace officers/firefighter members of CalPERS.

Status:                    Active

**AB 2985**                    **(McCarthy (R)) – Suspension of New Health Care Law**

Purpose:                    To suspend SB 2, the new health care law that requires certain employers to provide health care coverage to employees. The suspension would apply when the unemployment rate is 7% or higher, and would last for a minimum of 2 years. California’s current unemployment rate, as of February 2004 is 6.2%.

Status:                    Active

**AB 2990**                    **(McCarthy (R)) – Health Savings Accounts**

Purpose:                    To allow health care service plans to offer high deductible plans for employees with health savings accounts, which would essentially discourage preventative medical treatment and would encourage employers to offer high deductible plans and reduce employee health benefits.

A health savings account is a tax exempt account for the purpose of paying the medical expenses of the account beneficiary.

Status: Active

**AB 2992**      **(McCarthy (R)) – Contracting Out Classified Jobs**

Purpose: To repeal various sections of law dealing with contracting out services performed by classified school employees.

Status: Active

**AB 1X**      **(Daucher - (R)) – Home Rule School Districts**

Purpose: To authorize school districts to become home rule charter school districts, exempting them from laws and requirements imposed on public schools.

Status: *Failed Passage*

**AB4X 1**      **(Maldonado) – Workers’ Compensation Cutbacks**

Purpose: To impose takeaways from injured workers by creating an independent medical review process where a worker’s injury is assessed by a doctor who never actual sees the worker, and to impose “objective findings” to determine permanent disability ratings that will result in eliminating pain as a factor.

Status: Active

**ACA 6**      **(Campbell - (R)) – Expenditure Limits**

Purpose: To repeal existing expenditure limits on state and local governments, and replace them with new and more onerous spending limits, which would result in future reductions in spending for education and other public services.

Status: Active

**ACA 21**      **(Bogh (R)) – General Fund Transfer (Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax Revenue)**

Purpose: To change the vote requirement to suspend the transfer of Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax Revenue from the General Fund from 2/3 to 4/5, resulting in further limiting the Legislature’s ability to address the state’s current fiscal crisis.

Status: Active

**ACA 28**      **(McCarthy (R)) – Contracting Out**

Purpose: To change the State Constitution to allow for the state to contract out any and all functions currently performed by state civil service employees.

Status: Active

**ACA5X 4**      **(Keene (R)) – State Spending Cap**

Purpose: To cap state spending to per capita personal income and state population growth. This could result in the loss of \$2 billion to K-12 spending in the long run.

Status: Active

**SB 6**      **(Alpert (D)) – Chief Education Office**

Purpose: To diminish the role and the duties of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and instead establish a Chief Education Officer to oversee all fiscal activities and accountability of school districts and county offices of education.

Status: Active

**SB 9** **(McClintock-(R)) – Reorganization of Government**

Purpose: To repeal laws granting specified state employees safety retirement benefits and roll back their pensions to a lower level.

Status: Active

**SB 346** **(Scott (D)) – Governing Boards Compensation**

Purpose: To eliminate the ability of voters to reject, by referendum, local community college boards giving themselves a 5% raise (without a cap) each year.

Status: Active

**SB 354** **(Speier (D)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To establish an independent medical review process for workers’ compensation, which will result in unnecessary delays in payment of benefits; to prohibit an injured worker from receiving more than 15 one-hour chiropractic visits, unless approval of the insurer is granted.

Status: Active

**SB 365** **(Johnson-R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To revise liability standards under workers’ compensation from an injury proximately caused by employment to where employment is the predominant cause of the injury compared to all other causes combined, making establishment of a workers’ compensation claim more difficult.

Status: Active

**SB 366** **(Johnson - (R)) – Workers’ Compensation: Psychiatric Injuries**

Purpose: To increase the threshold for establishing proof of a psychiatric injury under workers’ compensation from a preponderance of evidence to clear and convincing evidence, making it harder to establish a claim.

Status: Active

**SB 414** **(McClintock (R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To revise the definition of a workers’ compensation injury to an injury or disease that is certified by a physician using medical evidence based on objective findings since many injuries cannot be so certified; this will harm many injured workers.

Status: Active

**SB 674** **(Aanestad-(R)) – Four-Day School Week**

Purpose: To authorize the Reeds Creek Elementary School District to operate schools on a four-day schedule, with no provisions for collective bargaining.

Status: Active

**SB 714**                    **(Battin-(R)) – Workers’ Compensation: Limitation of Benefits**

Purpose:                    To increase the thresholds for determining permanent disability and prohibit payment of permanent disability and death benefits unless the industrial injury has contributed at least 10% to the cause or disability.

Status:                    Active

**SB 789**                    **(Johnson (R)) – Repeal of CSEA Sponsored Legislation**

Purpose:                    To repeal SB 1419 (Alarcón) regarding contracting out, AB 500 (Goldberg) regarding short-term employees, and AB 2849 (Washington) regarding part-time playground employees.

Status:                    Active

**SB 790**                    **(Johnson-(R)) – Reopening Collective Bargaining Agreements**

Purpose:                    To authorize school districts to reopen existing collective bargaining agreements to adjust the agreements to consider the changed financial conditions as a result of the downturn in the economy.

Status:                    Active

**SB 935**                    **(Knight-(R)) – Capital Gains Taxes**

Purpose:                    To exclude capital gains from investments in small corporations as part of the calculation of gross income. This proposal would reduce tax revenues; and therefore, have a negative impact on Proposition 98 revenues.

Status:                    Active

**SB 1174**                    **(Johnson (R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose:                    To repeal the liberal construction principle in workers’ compensation, require the employee to meet a higher standard of proof for occupational disease or cumulative injury, and make other changes to workers’ compensation law. The liberal construction principal states that workers’ compensation laws shall be liberally construed in favor of injured workers.

Status:                    Active

**SB 1179**                    **(Ducheny (D)) – Tax Exemption: Enterprise Zones**

Purpose:                    To extend the amount of time an area may be designated an Enterprise Zone from 15-20 years. This would provide those areas an additional five years of tax benefits. An Enterprise Zone is a defined geographic area in which business can claim certain state income tax savings and other advantages. Enterprise Zones were created to stimulate business investments in areas that are economically disadvantaged, as well as create job growth in areas of high unemployment. While worthy, this extension would reduce state General Fund revenues.

Status:                    Active

**SB 1204**                    **(Margett (R)) – Labor Compliance Programs**

Purpose:                    To repeal existing law that requires agencies that use Kindergarten-University Public Education

Facilities Bond Act funds for public works projects to be responsible for initiating and enforcing a labor compliance program.

Status: Active

**SB 1209** **(Scott (D)) – Bus Drivers**

Purpose: To impose an extra penalty of \$250 and \$50 per point on any driver who accumulates four or more points on his/her driving record. This bill would revoke the license of any driver who fails to pay this penalty. This would especially be punitive to school bus and other commercial drivers who spend more time on the road and drive more miles.

Status: Active

**SB 1210** **(Torlakson (D)) – Outsourcing: Design Build**

Purpose: To expand outsourcing of state transportation using “design build” contracts which eliminate competitive bidding and replace it with a “best value” model. This model removes cost as a factor and makes it easier to outsource jobs.

Status: Active

**SB 1295** **(Morrow (R)) – Tax Exemption: Manufacturers Investment Tax Credit**

Purpose: To reinstate the manufactures investment tax credit (MIC) at a rate of 8% of the cost of qualified manufacturing property. This bill would reduce general fund revenues, and consequently, have a detrimental effect on education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**SB 1311** **(Johnson (R)) – Workers’ Compensation: Carve Outs**

Purpose: To expand the existing “carve out” provision. Carve outs allow unions to negotiate alternative dispute resolution processes outside of the workers’ compensation system, to apply to non-union employers. This creates an uneven playing field, since non-union employees do not have a voice in the carve out decision and cannot reject the decision.

Status: Active

**SB 1377** **(Morrow (R)) – Contracting Out Classified Jobs**

Purpose: To repeal various provisions of current law regarding contracting out of classified jobs and make it easier to contract out jobs.

Status: Active

**SB 1503** **(McClintock (R)) – Repeal of Non-Resident Tuition**

Purpose: To repeal waivers of nonresident tuition for students who do not have legal immigration status and, therefore, are prevented from establishing residency for tuition purposes. Studies have found that the more educated a society becomes the better off the society is as a whole. Additionally, CSEA supported AB 540 (Firebaugh/2002) which established an exemption from non-resident tuition for any non-resident student at California State University or California Community Colleges meeting specific criteria.

Status: Active

**SB 1523** **(Ashburn (R)) – Tax Exemption: Wage Credit**

Purpose: To establish a statewide wage credit for employers who hire qualified employees. The credit would be in effect from January 1, 2005 to January 1, 2010. This type of credit would significantly reduce state general fund revenues, and consequently, have a detrimental effect on funding for education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**SB 1531**      **Knight (R) – Charter School: Operation**

Purpose: To delete the restriction on the number of charter schools in California.

Status: Active

**SB 1561**      **Battin (R) – California National Guard**

Purpose: To allow a tax credit of 100% of the fair market value of any donation made for the construction, maintenance or refurbishment of the California National Armory. This bill would result in reduced general fund revenues, which would have a detrimental impact on funding for education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**SB 1572**      **Alpert (D) – Tax Credits for Bioscience Companies**

Purpose: To provide a package of tax credits and other benefits for qualified bioscience companies. This bill would result in reduced general fund revenues which would have a detrimental impact on funding for education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**SB 1734**      **Battin (D) – Sweatshop Labor**

Purpose: To repeal laws protecting sweatshop workers by requiring that overtime be voluntary and that contractors must maintain a policy of not terminating employees except for just cause.

Status: Active

**SB 1793**      **McPherson (R) – Contracting Out**

Purpose: To expand contracting out of state services by utilizing design-build procurement models. Design build allows public agencies to use subjective selection criteria for selecting contractors, rather than objective criteria otherwise specified in current state law.

Status: Active

**SB 1829**      **Knight (R) – Family Disability Leave**

Purpose: To repeal the family temporary disability leave laws, which provide up to 6 weeks of wage replacement to care for a seriously ill child, spouse, parent, domestic partner or to bond with a new child.

Status: Active

**SB 1861**      **Ashburn (R) – Private Attorney General Act of 2004**

Purpose: To weaken the Private Attorney General Act of 2004 by requiring employees to first report violations to the Labor and Workforce Development Agency (LWDA) and create a minimum 60-day waiting period. This Act was put in place due to the lack of staff and resources in the LWDA, so this bill simply delays justice for workers and could result in nullifying the Act.

Status: Active

**SBX 1** **(Poochigian - (R)) – Suspension of Labor Laws**

Purpose: To suspend various laws, including Agricultural Labor Relations Act mediation, unemployment benefits and other labor laws until the California economy has fully recovered from the recession.

Status: Active

**SB4X 3** **(Poochigian (R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To eliminate employees’ free choice of physicians under workers’ compensation law and eliminate most compensable injuries covered under permanent disability.

Status: Active

**SB4X 4** **(Johnson (R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To require work to be predominant cause of a workers’ compensation injury in order to be compensable and changes the system from a “fault” system, but requires injured workers to meet a higher burden of proof than is required in tort cases.

Status: Active

**SB4X 5** **(Johnson (R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To raise the standard for psychiatric injuries to proof by clear and convincing evidence, effectively eliminating psychiatric injuries.

Status: Active

**SB4X 6** **(Johnson (R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To reverse a court decision and allow employers to deduct workers’ compensation costs from bonuses, forcing workers to pay for their own workers’ compensation coverage.

Status: Active

**SB4X 13** **(Johnson (R)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To repeal provisions in law requiring that workers’ compensation be liberally construed with the purpose of extending benefits for the protection of injured workers and to make various other changes to reduce benefits to injured workers.

Status: Active

**SCA 15** **(McClintock (R)) – Contracting Out**

Purpose: To place a constitutional ballot amendment on the next statewide election to authorize the Governor to require any state agency to contract out any state service to the private sector.

Status: Active

**AB 4**                    **(Chan (D) and Dutra (D)) – Reinstatement Maximum Personal Income Tax Rates**

Purpose:                    To reinstate 10% and 11% maximum personal income tax rates. The 10% rate would apply to individuals and joint filers whose taxable income exceeds \$130,000 and \$260,000, respectively. The 11% rate would apply to individuals and joint filers whose taxable income exceeds \$260,000 and \$520,000, respectively. Increased revenues ensure that education programs continue to be funded and will mitigate cuts.

**AB 76**                    **(Corbett - (D)) - Discrimination**

Purpose:                    To make it unlawful for an employer to fail to take immediate and appropriate corrective action to prevent harassment of an employee by any person, once the employer knows or should have known of this conduct.

**AB 78**                    **(Reyes - (D)) – Vietnam War History**

Purpose:                    To express legislative intent to encourage school districts to include in history lessons the involvement of the Hmong people in the Vietnam War.

Status:                    *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 44*

**AB 92**                    **(J. Horton - (D)) – Civil Service Boards**

Purpose:                    To require that city legislative bodies with personnel commissions appoint one-half of civil service commissioners from the public-at-large and the other one-half from persons nominated by the exclusive representative, with one additional person appointed as a mutual chairperson.

Status:                    Active

**AB 98**                    **(Koretz - (D)) – Meal and Rest Periods**

Purpose:                    To require the Industrial Welfare Commission to adopt or amend working condition orders on or before July 1, 2004 to provide that an employee of a public agency who operates a

commercial vehicle is subject to the same regulations regarding meal and rest periods as employees of a private sector employer.

**AB 109**      **(Dymally - (D)) – Public School Employees: Negotiations**

Purpose: To add, providing substantially inaccurate information regarding financial resources to the union during negotiations, to the list of unlawful acts under the Educational Employment Relations Act (EERA).

**AB 152**      **Levine (D)) – Federal Conformity in Special Education**

Purpose: To make necessary statutory changes to conform state laws to federal requirements in special education.

Status: Active

**AB 184**      **(Lowenthal - (D)) – Department of Motor Vehicle Records**

Purpose: To add victims of domestic violence and stalking to the Secretary of State’s confidentiality program, so that their registration and drivers licenses are suppressed.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 720*

**AB 196**      **(Leno - (D)) – Discrimination**

Purpose: To expand the prohibition in law on sexual discrimination and harassment to include gender in the definition of sex.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 164*

**AB 205**      **(Goldberg - (D)) – Discrimination**

Purpose: To enact the Domestic Partners Rights and Responsibilities Act, setting forth the requirements for forming and terminating domestic partner rights and specifying what these rights include.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 421*

**AB 226**      **(Vargas (D)) – Life Insurance**

Purpose: To prohibit insurers from issuing life insurance policies to California employers where the employer is the beneficiary of the life insurance policy.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 328*

**AB 229**      **(Pacheco - (D)) – Public Contracts**

Purpose: To increase force account limits from \$15,000 to \$50,000, increasing the amount of services and repairs that can be done in-house by school districts.

**AB 254**      **(Montañez - (D)) – COBRA Benefits**

Purpose: To reduce the maximum rate charged for COBRA benefits from 213% of the applicable current group rate to 102% of the applicable group rate.

Status: Active

**AB 255**      **(Horton - (D)) – School Districts: Elections**

Purpose: To make it a misdemeanor to use a school district seal in a campaign mass mailer with the intent to deceive voters.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 380*

**AB 274**      **(Koretz - (D)) – Employment Discrimination**

Purpose: To create a rebuttable presumption that an adverse action taken within 90 days after an employee exercises his or her employment rights is retaliatory.

Status: *Vetoed*

**AB 276**      **(Koretz - (D)) – Labor Code Violations**

Purpose: To increase the monetary penalties for labor code violations from a maximum of \$1,000 to \$5,000, and to provide that the first 12.5% of penalties shall be placed into a fund to educate employers about state labor laws.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 329*

**AB 310**      **(Kehoe - (D)) – Union Dues**

Purpose: To require school and community college districts to transmit union dues, service fees, agency fees or fair share fees to the employee organization within 15 days of issuing the paycheck containing the deduction.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 344*

**AB 331**      **(Kehoe - (D)) – Unemployment Benefits: Waiting Period**

Purpose: To waive the one-week waiting period for unemployment for any individual who is unemployed due to a lock-out related to a labor dispute.

**AB 358**      **(Jackson (D)) – Gender Discrimination**

Purpose: To require the state to implement the Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) by addressing discrimination and ensuring that the state does not discriminate against women through the allocation of funding or the delivery of services.

**AB 359**      **(Koretz - (D)) – Off- Duty Employment – Public Safety Officers**

Purpose: To ensure that no public safety officer be prohibited from working off-duty, except pursuant to written regulations adopted by the employing public safety department.

**AB 457**      **(Negrete McLeod - (D)) – Golden Handshake**

Purpose: To authorize specified state, local and school employees, upon determination by their employer, to receive an additional 2 years of service credit and 2 years of age credit if they retire within a designated period, prior to January 1, 2005.

**AB 459**                    **(Negrete-McLeod (D)) – Health Care**

Purpose: To require health carriers in the Public Employees’ Medical and Hospital Care Act (PEMHCA) to provide specified disease management programs, and create a panel to monitor compliance with disease management programs.

**AB 464**                    **(Levine (D)) – Adult Day Care Centers**

Purpose: To prohibit adult day health care centers from discriminating because of race, color, creed, national origin, sex or disability and would prohibit these centers from requiring family members to assist with daily living activities.

**AB 475**                    **(Correa - (D)) – PERS Home Loan Program**

Purpose: To allow the CalPERS Board to increase the maximum home loan to 100% of the home value, subject to specified conditions.

**AB 476**                    **(Correa - (D)) – Health Care**

**AB 503**                    **(Kehoe - (D)) – Employee Communications**

Purpose: To provide that employee organizations are not prohibited from using institutional bulletin boards, mail boxes or other direct communications for support or defeat of candidates or initiatives provided they reimburse the district for the cost of these mediums.

**AB 515**                    **(Matthews - (D)) – Contracting Out**

Purpose: To increase the threshold requiring work in counties to be contracted out from \$6,500 to \$20,000, and to adjust this amount for inflation.

Purpose: To establish timelines and standards for the Labor Commissioner’s investigation of complaints and to permit aggrieved employers to pursue a civil action to contest discharges or discrimination complaints.

Purpose: To require that labor relations be considered in the next cycle in which the K-12 history – social science curriculum framework is adopted.

Purpose: To prohibit school districts from acquiring 15 passenger vans and only allows school districts to operate existing 15 passenger vans if the driver has a commercial drivers license.

**AB 634** **(Steinberg (D)) – Elder Abuse**

Purpose: To provide that it is the policy of the State of California that no confidentiality agreements are entered into in cases involving elder abuse.

Purpose: To establish an advisory commission to develop three alternative ways to commemorate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Supreme Court decision in Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka.

**AB 660** **(Corbett-(D)) – Master Plan for Pupil Support**

Purpose: To require the Department of Education to convene a voluntary working group to develop a five-year master plan for pupil services.

**AB 719** **(Negrete-McLeod - (D)) – Service Credit Enhancement**

Purpose: To authorize school, state and local agency members of CalPERS to purchase up to 5-years of additional service credit time, for retirement, thereby enhancing retirement benefits.

Purpose: To delete the limit on the amount of reimbursement for release time for CalPERS elected board members.

Purpose: To provide for a private/public partnership program to improve career technical education.

Purpose: To require that all contracts for public works projects financed through the High Speed Passenger Train Bond Act for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century adhere to statute related prevailing wages.

**AB 1527**      **(Frommer (D)) – Health Care Coverage**

Purpose: To require employers with 51 employees or more, to provide health care coverage to their employees and their dependents, unless the employer pays the Employment Development Department a percentage of its payroll, which will be used for alternative health coverage for the employees.

**AB 1582**      **(Koretz-(D)) – Abusive Work Environments**

Purpose: To make it an unlawful employment practice to subject an employee to an abusive work environment or to retaliate against an employee because the employee has opposed an unlawful employment practice under this bill.

**AB 1586**                    **(Public Employees, Retirement and Social Security Committee) – Cash Balance Plan**

Purpose: To provide that part-time community college classified employees who are excluded from California Public Employees Retirement System (CalPERS) coverage are eligible for membership in the State Teachers' Retirement System (STRS) Cash Balance Plan, which requires employers to match employee contributions of 3.5%.

Purpose: To authorize Franchise Tax Board to investigate individuals and corporations that hide income through abusive or illegal tax shelters. Illegal tax shelters reduce the revenues to the General Fund. This reduction in General Fund dollars has a negative effect on Proposition 98 funds.

**AB 1611**                    **(Levine-(D)) – Employer Paid Retiree Health Benefits**

Purpose: To provide that if an employee retires from an agency that contracts to CalPERS for health benefits and is fully vested for retiree health care, and later reinstates to work with an employer who does not contract with CalPERS for health care, they shall not lose their right to retiree health care.

**AB 1628**                    **(Frommer-(D)) – Billings**

Purpose: To prohibit health plans for billing enrollees for any fees other than the normal co-payments, when there is a disagreement between the health plan and the health provider about services rendered.

**AB 1636**                    **(Kehoe (D)) – Federal Conformity in Food Services**

Purpose: To allow a local education agency to use information contained on the School Lunch Program application to identify pupils eligible for public school choice and supplemental services as required by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.

Status: Active

**AB 1715**                    **(Corbett-(D)) – Employment Arbitration Arguments**

Purpose: To make it unlawful for an employer to require an employee to waive rights or procedures under the Fair Employment and Housing Act as a condition of employment.

Status: *Vetoed*

**AB 1815**                    **(Chan (D)/Dutra (D)) – Personal Income Tax Rates**

Purpose: To impose 10% and 11% maximum rates for taxpayers with taxable incomes over certain amounts, and impose an 8.5% maximum rate based on the taxpayer's alternative minimum taxable income. Increased revenues ensure that education, programs and classified positions will continue to be funded without being subjected to draconian cuts.

Status: Active

**AB 1825**                    **(Reyes (D)) – Sexual Harassment Training**

Purpose: To require employers of three or more employees to post information concerning the illegality of sexual harassment and remedies available to victims of sexual harassment and to provide two hours of training and education to all supervisory employees.

Status: Active

**AB 1829** **(Liu (D)) – Contracting Out: Offshore Workers**

Purpose: To prohibit a state agency from contracting for services with a contractor unless they certify that the work will be performed solely with workers within the United States.

Status: Active

**AB 1872** **(Nakano (D)) – Labor History**

Purpose: To require instructional materials adopted by the state for social science, history or civics to contain information about California’s labor history.

Status: Active

**AB 1914** **(Montanez (D)) – Prison Education Reform**

Purpose: To develop a 5-year comprehensive plan for a unified correctional education system.

Status: Active

**AB 1918** **(Montanez (D)) – School Employees Leaves**

Purpose: To allow classified and certificated employees to use up to 6 weeks of their 5-month extended sick leave to care for a seriously ill child, spouse, parent, domestic partner, or to bond with a new child.

Status: Active

**AB 1950** **(Wiggins (D)) – Identity Theft**

Purpose: To require businesses that obtain personal information to implement and maintain effective safeguards to ensure the security of the information and to protect it against loss and unauthorized use.

Status: Active

**AB 1957** **(Frommer (D)) – Prescription Drugs**

Purpose: To require the California Board of Pharmacy to establish a website with links to certified Canadian pharmacies, so Californians could safely purchase prescription drugs. This bill also creates a pilot program to allow the State to purchase Canadian prescription drugs for State departments and agencies.

Status: Active

**AB 1958** **(Frommer (D)) – CalPERS Pharmaceutical Purchasing Consortium**

Purpose: To authorize the CalPERS Board to establish or enter into pharmaceutical purchasing consortiums with private or public entities.

Status: Active

**AB 1959** **(Chu (D)) – Drug Contracts**

Purpose: To allow the chairpersons of the Assembly and Senate Budget and Health Committees to review contracts with the State Department of Health Services and drug manufacturers that were exempt from competitive bid and are exclusive contracts.

Status: Active

**AB 1960** **(Pavley (D)) – Pharmacy Benefit Management**

Purpose: To require a fiduciary duty between Pharmacy Benefit Managers and their clients, to ensure consumers have oversight on how Pharmacy Benefit Managers negotiate prices for drugs, and will hold Pharmacy Benefit Managers accountable, particularly for any financial incentives they receive from drug manufacturers.

Status: Active

**AB 2017** **(Bermudez (D)) – Pupil Volunteer Award Program**

Purpose: To establish the Pupil Volunteer Award Program to promote pupil community service.

Status: Active

**AB 2132** **(Chan (D)) – Asthma**

Purpose: To authorize pupils to self administer asthma medication in any area of the school grounds, during any school related activity, with written parental consent.

Status: Active

**AB 2185** **(Frommer (D)) – Asthma Nebulizers and equipment**

Purpose: To require HMO coverage that includes outpatient prescription drug coverage to include devices and equipment necessary to manage asthma.

Status: Active

**AB 2208** **(Kehoe (D)) – Domestic Partners**

Purpose: To require health care plans to provide coverage to domestic partners of employees, that is equal to the coverage provided to the spouses of employees.

Status: Active

**AB 2213** **(Goldberg (D)) – Janitorial Contracts**

Purpose: To state the Legislature’s intent that the Labor Commissioner report on labor law violations and enforcement in the janitorial service industry.

Status: Active

**AB 2240** **(Oropeza (D)) – Equity in Athletics**

Purpose: To enact the Equity in Athletics Bill of Rights, which ensures that students are informed of their rights to fair and equitable treatment and protected from discrimination in athletic programs based on sex.

Status: Active

**AB 2323** **(Jackson (D)) – Gender Equity in Athletics**

Purpose: To require the Department of Education to develop a Gender Equity Compliance Survey, and require each high school to report the results of the annual survey at a regularly scheduled board meeting.

Status: Active

**AB 2326** **(Corbett (D)) – Prescription Drugs**

Purpose: To require the creation of an advisory, evidence based, preferred drug list in California, which would serve as a “drug report card”, so that consumers and physicians can be more informed about drug choices.

Status: Active

**AB 2367** **(Chan (D)) – Asthma Medication**

Purpose: To require school districts to allow students to carry and self administer inhaled asthma medication during the school day or on a field trip, with parental authorization and physician authorization.

Status: Active

**AB 2387** **(Firebaugh (D)) – Discrimination in Education**

Purpose: To declare the Legislature’s intent that the holding of Grutter v. Bollinger (2003) 539 U.S. 306, that the narrowly tailored use of race in admissions to college, is not an illegal preference under the California Constitution.

Status: Active

**AB 2404** **(Steinberg (D)) – Discrimination in Athletic Programs**

Purpose: To prohibit local governmental agencies from discriminating against any person based on gender in any community youth athletic program or activity.

Status: Active

**AB 2407** **(Bermudez (D)) – Full Day Kindergarten**

Purpose: To give school districts the ability to offer a voluntary full-day Kindergarten program, instead of restricting Kindergarten to only four hours a day.

Status: Active

**AB 2462** **(Parra (D)) – Home-To-School Transportation**

Purpose: To provide home to school transportation programs annual funding increases based on enrollment in Kindergarten and grades 1 – 12 inclusive.

Status: Active

**AB 2472** **(Wolk (D)) – California Tax Court**

Purpose: To create the California Tax Court, which would become the forum to hear and determine appeals from taxpayers with respect to certain tax determinations and assessments.

Status: Active

**AB 2494** **(Lieber (D)) – Grocery Store Employee Health Care**

Purpose: To require large grocery stores to provide health care to their employees or to indemnify all state and local agencies for expenses in providing health care to these grocery store's employees.

Status: Active

**AB 2545** **(Koretz (D)) – Locking In Employees**

Purpose: To prohibit employers from physically preventing an employee from exiting a place of employment by locking the doors, windows, or other exits, and to make it a misdemeanor for an employer to knowingly, negligently or repeatedly violate this provision.

Status: Active

**AB 2584** **(Chu (D)) – Tax Loophole U.S. Corporations**

Purpose: To prevent publicly traded U.S. Corporations from using a tax loophole to claim their corporate residence as a foreign country like Bermuda and the Cayman Islands, thereby avoiding paying state taxes. This bill would provide more general fund revenue which will help mitigating cuts to education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**AB 2637** **(Diaz (D)) – Whistleblower Protection for CSU Employees**

Purpose: To establish procedures to protect CSU employees from retaliation for disclosing allegations for improper government activities.

Status: Active

**AB 2662** **(Jackson (D)) – Gender Discrimination**

Purpose: To require the Governor and the Legislature to implement the principles underlying the United Nation's Convention of the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), and address discrimination against women and girls. These principals include addressing areas of discrimination in economic development, education, employment practices, health care, etc.

Status: Active

**AB 2686** **(Jackson (D)) – National School Lunch Program**

Purpose: To require the governing board of a school district participating in the National School Lunch Program, to post in each school, information regarding the nutritional content of the lunches and to limit the fat in entrees served as part of the program.

Status: Active

**AB 2730** **(Dymally (D)) – Unemployment Compensation: Reasonable Assurances of Employment**

Purpose: To clarify that reasonable assurances of employment must be made by educational institutions in writing and must be signed by both parties.

Status: Active

**AB 2752** **(Chu (D)) – Corporations: Board Elections**

Purpose: To require corporations doing business in California to allow shareholders the right to make director nominations and have such nominations included in the corporation's proxy statements and proxy cards. This will allow pension funds and other shareholders fair access to the board election process.

Status: Active

**AB 2813**      **(Nunez (D)) – Tax Exemption: Federal Earned Income Tax Credit**

Purpose: To require employers to notify all employees that they may be eligible for the federal earned income tax credit. The earned income tax credit is a federal income tax credit for low income workers who are eligible for and can claim the credit on their income tax forms.

Status: Active

**AB 2832**      **(Lieber (D)) – Minimum Wage**

Purpose: To increase the minimum wage to \$7.25 as of January 1, 2005 and \$7.75 as of January 1, 2006.

Status: Active

**AB 2849**      **(Lowenthal (D)) – Non-Faculty CSU Trustee**

Purpose: To increase the membership to the CSU Trustees to require the Governor to appoint a non-faculty employee for a two-year term, including classified employees.

Status: Active

**AB 2889**      **(Laird (D)) – Employment Discrimination**

Purpose: To make employers responsible for the acts of non-employees with respect to harassment, where the employer knew or should have known about the harassment, but failed to take immediate or corrective action.

Status: Active

**AB 2938**      **(Plescia (R)) – State Lottery Revenues**

Purpose: To increase funding for prizes in the lottery so that total funding for education might go up. Education is guaranteed funding of at least \$1 billion, and the bill's experiment sunsets on June 30, 2011.

Status: Active

**AB 3001**      **(Nunez (D)) – Portable Classroom Inventory**

Purpose: To require the Division of State Architect, in consultation with other appropriate entities, including the Department of Education, to conduct a survey to assess the age and condition of portable classrooms and to submit a report to the Legislature on or before July 30, 2005.

Status: Active

**AB 3013**      **(Pavley (D)) – Identity Theft**

Purpose: To require that no more than the last 5 digits of a credit card number be printed on a cardholders statement, to stem the number of identity theft cases that happen as a result of mail theft.

Status: Active

**AB 3016**      **(Pavley (D)) – Employers Use of Social Security Numbers**

Purpose: To close a loophole that allows employers to use Social Security numbers of employees, in ways otherwise prohibited, as long as the usage has been continuous and commenced prior to July 2002, and employees have had the right to opt out of this practice.

Status: Active

**AB 3021**      **(Koretz (D)) – Payroll Reports**

Purpose: To require employers to include in its wage and contribution reports, information relating to the number of jobs the employer maintained in California, the U.S. and worldwide.

Status: Active

**AB 3037**      **(Dymally (D)) – Employment Health and Safety**

Purpose: To prohibit employers from taking adverse employment actions against employees who file complaints relating to employee health and safety, and provides employees with reinstatement rights, lost wages, and reasonable attorney fees.

Status: Active

**ACA 4**      **(Simitian-(D)) – 55% Vote for Parcel Tax**

Purpose: To authorize a school district, community college, or county offices of education, with the approval of 55% of its voters to impose a parcel tax.

Status: Active

**ACA 16**      **(Hancock (D)) – Assessment of Non-Residential Property**

Purpose: To require all non-residential property that is not used for permanent or long term commercial agricultural production to be assessed at market value on an annual basis. This bill would increase general fund revenues, and consequently provide more funding for education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**ACR 63**      **(Firebaugh-(D)) – Cesar Chavez Day**

Purpose: To recognize March 31 as the anniversary of the birth of Cesar Chavez and urge all Californians to participate in observances to remember Cesar Chavez as a symbol of hope and justice to all people.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Resolution Chapter No. 32*

**ACR 70**      **(Chan (D)) – Nutrition Week**

Purpose: To proclaim the week of April 28 to May 2 to be YEAH (Youth Eating and Acting Healthy) Children’s Fitness Week, and to encourage healthy eating and exercise.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Resolution Chapter No. 37*

**ACR 72**      **(Koretz (D)) – Labor History Week**

Purpose: To recognize the first week in April as Labor History Week and encourage the public schools to commemorate the week with appropriate exercises.

Status: Active

**ACR 79**      **(Lieber (D)) – Equal Pay Day**

Purpose: To declare April 15 as Equal Pay Day in California and urge Californians to recognize the full value of women’s skills and significant contributions to the labor force.

Active: *Chapters by Secretary of State. Resolution Chapter No. 51*

**ACR 146**      **(Chan (D)) – Women’s Heart Month**

Purpose: To recognize the month of February as American Heart Month in California in order to raise awareness of the effects of heart disease in women.

Status: Active

**ACR 154**      **(Matthews (D)) – Elder and Dependent Adult Abuse**

Purpose: To proclaim May as Elder and Dependent Adult Abuse Awareness Month, so private citizens and public agencies can work together to combat crime and violence against elder and dependent adults, and to give our “Greatest Generation” the respect and dignity they deserve.

Status: Active

**ACR 161**      **(Oropeza (D)) – California Girls and Women in Sports Week**

Purpose: To commemorate and celebrate the accomplishments of female athletes, coaches and officials for promoting and contributing to the value of sports, by proclaiming February 2–6 as the California Girls and Women in Sports Week.

Status: Active

**ACR 165**      **(Horton (D)) – Black History Month**

Purpose: To recognize February 2004 as Black History Month and to urge and encourage participation in celebrating the accomplishments of African-Americans.

Status: Active

**ACR 193**      **(Liu (D)) – High-Quality Higher Education**

Purpose: To declare the commitment of the Legislature to develop state policy and budgets that place top priority on quality higher education consistent with the Master Plan for Higher Education.

Status: Active

**ACR 196**      **(Firebaugh (D)) – Cesar Chavez Day**

Purpose: To recognize March 31<sup>st</sup> as the anniversary of the birth of Cesar Chavez, and would call upon all Californians to participate in appropriate observance to remember Cesar Chavez as a symbol of hope and justice to all persons.

Status: Active

**AJR 12**      **(Chan-(D)) – Head Start Program**

Purpose: To request Congress to acknowledge the success and maintain funding for the Head Start Program.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Resolution Chapter No. 72*

**AJR 55**      **(Reyes (D)) – Violence Against Children Act of 2003**

Purpose: To encourage Congress to pass and the President to sign the Violence Against Children Act, which toughens penalties for crimes against children.

Status: Active

**AJR 62**      **(Ridley-Thomas (D)) – Prescription Drugs and Medicare**

Purpose: To urge Congress to repeal the provisions of the Medicare drug bill that prohibit the federal government from negotiating Medicare drug costs.

Status: Active

**AJR 66**      **(Lieber (D) - Equal Pay Day**

Purpose: To proclaim April 20 as Equal Pay Day, and urge Congress to protect the fundamental right of all American women to receive equal pay for equal work, and to fund remedies for victims of discrimination in pay due to their sex.

Status: Active

**AJR 68**      **(Parra (D)) – Federal Child Nutrition Program**

Purpose: To urge the President and Congress to eliminate the reduced price school meals program category, and replace it with an expanded free lunch program to cover students eligible for the reduced price lunch program.

Status: Active

**SB 2**      **(Burton - (D)) – Health Insurance**

Purpose: To declare the intent of the Legislature to develop an employer based health care coverage system that provides health insurance to every employee in California.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 673*

**SB 17**      **(Escutia (D)) – Real Property – Change of Ownership**

Purpose: To ensure that nonresidential property is reassessed upon change of ownership to market value, consistent with the reassessment of residential property.

Status: Active

**SB 25**      **(Bowen-(D)) – Identity Theft**

Purpose: To prohibit state and local agencies, including school districts, from using an individual's social security number in certain ways, including publicly posting it.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 907*

**SB 26**      **(Figueroa - (D)) – Consumer Credit Reporting**

Purpose: To prohibit health care providers from reporting health care consumers as delinquent to a credit reporting agency if the provider reasonably expects payment from a health care service plan.

Status: *Failed Passage*

**SB 57**                    **(Burton - (D)) – Minimum Wage**

Purpose:                    To adjust the hourly minimum wage on January 1, 2004 to maintain purchasing power based on the federal Consumer Price Index.

Status:                    Active

**SB 76**                    **(Denham (R)) – Waiver for In-House Suspension**

Purpose:                    To authorize school districts to request a waiver from the State Board of Education to claim funding for pupils attending a suspension classroom staffed by a classified school employee.

Status:                    Active

**SB 78**                    **(Torlakson - (D)) – Physical Education**

Purpose:                    To require the State Department of Education to encourage schools to provide quality physical education that develops the knowledge, attitudes, skills, behavior, and motivation needed to be fit for life

Status:                    *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 459*

**SB 103**                    **(Alpert (D)) – Sales Tax Nexus**

Purpose:                    To clarify existing law in that the processing of orders by fax, telephone, or the internet does not relieve a retailer of responsibility for collecting tax from the purchaser if the retailer is engaged in business in California.

Status:                    *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 655*

**SB 123**                    **(Escutia (D)) – Clean School Restrooms**

Purpose:                    To state the intent of the Legislature to ensure that every public school has clean, well stocked restroom facilities.

Status:                    Active

**SB 158**                    **(Alarcón - (D)) – Contractors: Displaced Employees**

Purpose:                    To require public transit contractors who agree to retain employees of previous contractors, to establish specified bidding and seniority rights.

Status:                    *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 103*

**SB 160**                    **(Alarcón - (D)) – Contracting out: University of California**

Purpose:                    To provide that the University of California cannot contract out for services at a new facility that were previously performed in-house by an employee of the University of California.

**SB 163**                    **(Alarcón - (D)) – Contracting Out: Cities and Counties**

Purpose:                    To establish guidelines for contracting out for cities and counties similar to those guidelines that currently apply to schools and the state.

**SB 179**                    **(Alarcón - (D)) – Contracting Out**

Purpose:                    To provide that any person who enters into a labor contract when that person knows, or should know, that the contract does not provide funds sufficient to allow the labor contractor to comply with labor laws, is subject to liability.

**SB 191**                    **(Alarcón (D)) – Workers’ Compensation Rates**

Purpose:                    To stabilize workers’ compensation rates by requiring that rates not be excessive, provide a formula to determine whether rates are excessive and require the Insurance Commissioner to disapprove rates that are excessive.

**SB 228**                    **(Alarcón (D)) – Workers’ Compensation: Fee Schedule**

Purpose:                    To create a comprehensive medical fee schedule for all areas of medical treatment under workers’ compensation in order to control costs.

**SB 229**                    **(Burton (D)) – Workers’ Compensation: Health Benefits**

Purpose:                    To provide workers’ compensation rate protection for small employers who provide health insurance to their employees.

**SB 253**                    **(Cedillo - (D)) – Collective Bargaining**

Purpose:                    To allow confidential employees to be represented by a union under the Educational Employment Relations Act (EERA).

Status:                    *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 190*

**SB 259**                    **(Romero (D)) – Call to Active Military Duty**

Purpose:                    To permit school and community college district to provide differential pay and benefits, to any employee called to active military duty.

Status:                    *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 783*

**SB 268**                    **(Soto - (D)) – Retirement Service Credit**

Purpose:                    To allow a PERS member who has elected to purchase service credit, to discontinue payments if the member becomes disabled and the service credit payments will not result in a higher retirement allowance.

Status:                    *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 855*

**SB 269**                    **(Soto (D)) – CalPERS Investment Staff**

Purpose:                    To authorize CalPERS and CalSTRS to appoint and fix the compensation, according to specified principles, of the executive affairs, actuary, investment officials and portfolio managers. This legislation is needed to address a court decision limiting the boards’ authority on these matters.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 856*

**SB 302** **(Kuehl - (D)) – Discrimination: CSU**

Purpose: To extend prohibitions against discrimination that currently applies to the state, to also apply to the California State University.

Status: Active

**SB 325** **(Florez (D)) – Securities Fraud: Pension Protection**

Purpose: To extend the statute of limitations for securities fraud from three to five years, providing more time for pension funds or retirees to build their case and protect their retirement funds.

Status: Active

**SB 329** **(Perata (D)) – State Lottery**

Purpose: To allow the California State Lottery Commission to experiment with an increase in the percentages allocated to prizes, so that overall revenues might go up; thereby increasing the share of revenues to education.

Status: Active

**SB 352** **(Escutia (D)) – Smog Free Schools**

Purpose: To prevent new schools from being built within 1,000 feet of a freeway or busy roadway, unless it is determined through analysis that the air quality does not pose any significant acute or chronic health risks to pupils or staff.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 668*

**SB 355** **(Florez (D)) – Pension Protection: Securities Fraud**

Purpose: To provide that it is a crime to employ any device or scheme to defraud in connection with the offer, purchase or sale of any security.

Status: Active

**SB 395** **(Florez (D)) – Pension Protection**

Purpose: To make it a felony for directors, officers or other agents of corporations to, with the intent to defraud, destroy, alter, mutilate, or falsify documents.

Status: Active

**SB 473** **(Florez - (D)) – School Health Advisory Council**

Purpose: To require the Superintendent of Public Instruction to appoint a School Health Advisory Council, including a representative from CSEA, to recommend model health services programs.

Status: Active

**SB 574** **(Alpert (D)) – Workers' Compensation**

Purpose: To provide school districts, who sold off their old self-insured workers' compensation liabilities in good faith, with workers' compensation coverage to protect them from incurring \$7 million in liabilities due to the Fremont Insurance bankruptcy.

Status: Active

**SB 606**      **(Vasconcellos (D)) – Vision Screening**

Purpose: To require school districts that conduct vision screenings to also provide each pupil with a notice and questionnaire regarding his/her vision and to instruct the pupil to take it home to his/her parents.

Status: *Vetoed*

**SB 614**      **(Cedillo (D) and Burton (D)) – Tax Shelters**

Purpose: To increase penalties for engaging in abusive tax avoidance transactions. Abusive tax avoidance and abusive shelters have a negative effect on state revenues, which consequently has a negative effect on Proposition 98 funding.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 656*

**SB 640**      **(Burton - (D)) - Expatriate Corporations**

Purpose: To limit state agencies from contracting with expatriate corporations.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 657*

**SB 660**      **(Speier (D)) – Identity Theft**

Purpose: To establish procedures for keeping the social security numbers of persons involved in divorces and legal separations in confidential court files.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 154*

**SB 674**      **(Aanestad (R)) – 4-Day Work Week**

Purpose: To allow a school district to operate on a four-day school week only if the district and the exclusive representative mutually agree to the operation in a Memorandum of Understanding.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 237*

**SB 727**      **(Kuehl - (D)) – Family Leave**

Purpose: To make various conforming and clarifying changes in law in order to implement family leave provisions granting up to 6 weeks of paid leave to care for a seriously ill child, spouse, parent or domestic partner, or to bond with a new child.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 797*

**SB 766**      **(Florez (D)) – Protection of Retirement Funds**

Purpose: To expand the civil remedy against corporations who intentionally or recklessly participate or aid in the dissemination of false or misleading information affecting the price of publicly traded securities or in the manipulation of the market for publicly traded securities.

Status: Active

**SB 853**      **(Escutia (D)) – Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services**

Purpose: To require the Department of Managed Health Care to adopt regulations ensuring access to language assistance and culturally competent health care services.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 713*

**SB 888**                    **(Dunn (D)) – Outsourcing: Homeland Security**

Purpose: To prohibit any work involving information that is essential to homeland security from being located at a worksite outside of the United States, unless expertise or materials necessary to perform the work is not available in the U.S.

Status: Active

**SB 892**                    **(Murray - (D)) – Public School Restrooms**

Purpose: To authorize the use of deferred maintenance funds to maintain and supply pupil restrooms, and require properly maintained and supplied restrooms as a condition of receipt of matching funds.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 909*

**SB 921**                    **(Kuehl - (D)) – Universal Health Care**

Purpose: To establish a single comprehensive health plan for all California residents, at no new cost to the state, reducing administrative costs and guaranteeing health benefits for all residents.

Status: Active

**SB 996**                    **(Alarcón (D)) – Living Wage**

Purpose: To state the Legislature’s intent that when funds become available, the Division of Labor Statistics shall update its 2002 study titled “Living Wages: The Classes and the Impact”.

Status: Active

**SB 1064**                    **(Burton (D)) – Manufacturer’s Investment Credit**

Purpose: To clarify the amount of sales tax income that is available under the manufacturer’s investment credit and to revise the vote requirements needed for the Board of Equalization to overturn an appeal of any franchise tax board action.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Chapter No. 606*

**SB 1087**                    **(Soto (D)) – Safe Routes to School Program**

Purpose: To extend the sunset date for the safe routes to school program which provides grants and funding for projects like crosswalks, pedestrian and bike paths and bike lanes which increases the safety of our students as they travel to and from school.

Status: Active

**SB 1144**                    **(Burton (D)) – Canadian Prescription Drugs**

Purpose: To allow the Department of General Services to contract with Canadian sources to purchase drugs for corrections, state hospitals, and other state agencies. This bill also requires all contracts include safeguards, oversight, regulatory requirements, and directs the Department to seek Federal waivers and report cost savings.

Status: Active

**SB 1149**      **(Ortiz (D)) – Canadian Drugs**

Purpose: To require the State Board of Pharmacy to develop and disseminate information identifying pharmacies in Canada that meet standards for the safe acquisition, shipment, handling and dispensing of dangerous drugs to California residents. This bill also requires the Board to collect, publish and post on the internet, information about dangerous suppliers operating outside of the U.S.

Status: Active

**SB 1192**      **(Chesbro (D)) – Medically Necessary Substance Abuse Coverage**

Purpose: To require health insurers to provide coverage for medically necessary treatment of substance abuse.

Status: Active

**SB 1196**      **(Cedillo (D)) – Healthy Families and Other Health Programs**

Purpose: To authorize the sharing of the school lunch program applications for purposes of the Healthy Families Programs and any other applicable health insurance programs if parents consent to the sharing of information, so uninsured children can be enrolled in a health program they are eligible for.

Status: Active

**SB 1272**      **(Ortiz (D)) – Special Districts: Conflict of Interest**

Purpose: To prohibit special district governing board members from engaging in a business transaction or professional activity that is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties.

Status: Active

**SB 1279**      **(Bowen (D)) – Identity Theft**

Purpose: To require businesses that possess non-computerized data, including personal information of a consumer, to notify customers of any unauthorized disclosure of information.

Status: Active

**SB 1333**      **(Perata (D)) – Medi-Cal Drug Contracts**

Purpose: To authorize Medi-Cal and the aids drug assistance program to reimburse pharmacies that purchase drugs from legitimate Canadian pharmacies. This is an attempt to lower the drug costs in these programs.

Status: Active

**SB 1354**      **(Escutia (D)) – Limiting the Use of Tax Credits**

Purpose: To prohibit corporations from using tax credits to shelter more than 50% of their tax liability. The Franchise Tax Board estimates that this bill could raise approximately \$350 million which could be used to navigate further cuts to education, safety and health programs.

Status: Active

**SB 1424**      **(Burton (D)) – California Tax Court**

Purpose: To create the California Tax Court which would become the forum to hear and determine appeals from taxpayers with respect to certain tax determinations and assessments.

Status: Active

**SB 1452**      **(Figueroa (D)) – Outsourcing Jobs**

Purpose: To prohibit the state from contracting with any individual or entity that employs persons or contractors outside of the United States to perform and complete the state contract.

Status: Active

**SB 1453**      **(Figueroa (D)) – Outsourcing Jobs**

Purpose: To require any private sector employer that out sources jobs that would result in the displacement of 20 or more California workers, to give written notice to the employees and the Employment Development Department at least 60 days prior to layoff.

Status: Active

**SB 1492**      **(Dunn (D)) – Outsourcing**

Purpose: To protect the privacy and security of Californians by ensuring that no work involving information that is private, confidential, privileged or essential to homeland security can be performed at a works site outside of the United States.

Status: Active

**SB 1499**      **(Murray (D)) – Employee Paychecks: Fees**

Purpose: To prohibit a private sector employer from charging an employee a fee for cashing an employee's check.

Status; Active

**SB 1509**      **(Alpert (D)) – Hospital Costs**

Purpose: To prohibit health care providers from restraining competition by tying together the purchase of access to facilities, products and services.

Status: Active

**SB 1555**      **(Speier (D)) – Maternity Coverage**

Purpose: To require health insurance policies to provide coverage for maternity benefits.

Status: Active

**SB 1571**      **(Alpert (D)) – Tax Loopholes for Controlled Foreign Corporations**

Purpose: To close tax loopholes related to controlled foreign corporations. Closing these loopholes will

provide more General Fund dollars for education, health and safety programs.

Status: Active

**SB 1590**      **(Dunn (D)) – Personal Information**

Purpose: To protect the personal information of employees, volunteers, officers and other agents of a reproductive health facility, from being released under the California Public Records Act.

Status: Active

**SB 1618**      **(Battin (R)) – Social Security Numbers on Pay Stubs**

Purpose: To require all employers to only post the last four digits of their employees Social Security numbers on pay stubs, and would make it a misdemeanor for any violations.

Status: Active

**SB 1632**      **(Figueroa (D)) – Pension Plan Investments**

Purpose: To authorize the Treasurer to obtain information from corporations, where the state pensions have investments in the corporation, regarding the corporation's business relative to terrorism, slave or child labor, or human rights violations.

Status: Active

**SB 1633**      **(Figueroa (D)) – Children's Medical Information Privacy Act**

Purpose: To prohibit a business from obtaining personal information regarding a minor child without securing permission from the child's parents.

Status: Active

**SB 1638**      **(Romero (D)) – Contracting Out**

Purpose: To require the Governor to submit as part of the state budget, information on all current and proposed state service contracts.

Status: Active

**SB 1643**      **(Murray (D)) – Black History Month**

Purpose: To require the Governor to proclaim the month of February as Black History Month, and each February into the future.

Status: Active

**SB 1664**      **(Karnette (D)) – Protection of Personal Information**

Purpose: To require subcontractors of a business that is entrusted with a customer's personal information to properly destroy these records, and provides customers civil remedies if they are injured by the subcontractor's actions.

Status: Active

**SB 1760**      **(Perata (D)) – Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990**

Purpose: To expressly provide that the state consents to be sued in state or federal court by any person seeking to enforce the Americans with Disabilities Act, waiving immunity provisions under federal law.

Status: Active

**SB 1765** **(Sher (D)) – Pharmaceutical Marketing Practices**

Purpose: To prohibit pharmaceutical and drug manufacturers from giving gifts to medical or health professionals, with limited exceptions, including allowing for drug samples for patients.  
This is sponsored by the California Labor Federation, AFL-CIO.

Status: Active

**SB 1841** **(Bowen (D)) – Electronic Monitoring of Employees**

Purpose: To prohibit employers from engaging in electronic monitoring of employees without first providing notice to employees, except in specified circumstances.

Status: Active

**SB 1892** **(Burton (D)) – Contracting Out**

Purpose: To require the state to terminate contracts that do not comply with existing state law governing personal service contracts and require state agencies to notify the State Personnel Board of its intention to contract out, except in cases of emergencies.

Status: Active

**SB 1903** **(Florez (D)) – Locked Out Workers**

Purpose: To allow otherwise eligible “locked out” workers to receive unemployment compensation benefits, even if the unemployment is due to a labor dispute.

Status: Active

**SB4X 8** **(Alarcón (D)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To require that workers’ compensation rates not be excessive and that the Insurance Commissioner’s assess the rates that insurance companies charge, so reductions in costs are passed on to employers.

Status: Active

**SB4X 9** **Alarcón (D)) – Workers’ Compensation Clean Up**

Purpose: To enact technical clean-up to workers’ compensation law, re-enacting provisions that were mistakenly chaptered out of last year’s reforms. these provisions must be re-enacted in order to achieve the cost savings contained in last year’s bills.

Status: Active

**SB4X 16** **(Alarcón (D)) – Workers’ Compensation**

Purpose: To require that workers’ compensation rates not be excessive and establish the framework to require insurance companies to pass on savings in the workers’ compensation system to employers in the form of reduced premiums.

**SCA 18** **(Johnson (R) and Alpert (D)) – Election Reform and Sale of State Surplus Property**

Purpose: To put language in the State Constitution to ensure the widest possible range of choice for voters in a general election. Also accelerates repayment of Economic Recovery Bond through sale of surplus state property.

Status: Active

**SCR 13**                    **(Figueroa (D)) – Women’s History Month**

Purpose: To declare March as Women’s History month and urge all Californian’s and schools to honor the historical role and accomplishments of women in California and in the nation.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Resolution Chapter No. 22*

**SCR 20**                    **(Burton (D)) – Immigrant Workers Freedom Ride**

Purpose: To endorse the Immigrant Workers Freedom Ride, a national mobilization of individuals, organizations and unions to support the rights of immigrants and to make a mass show of support in Washington, D.C. and New York in the fall of 2003.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Resolution Chapter No. 125*

**SCR 55**                    **(Alpert (D)) – Educational Options Month**

Purpose: To proclaim May as Educational Options Month to encourage all Californians to work together to ensure the future success of every young student participating in educational options in our state.

Status: Active

**SJR 11**                    **(Alpert (D)) – Full Federal Funding Request**

Purpose: To urge the President and Congress to provide the full federal share of funding for special education programs to the states.

Status: *Chaptered by Secretary of State. Resolution Chapter No. 68*
